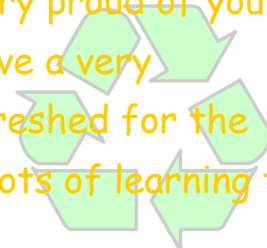

STEM

Last Tuesday I met with the STEM "Start Up" group. We discussed the final plans and how the builders will establish their work area. The work will begin during the holidays and we expect the work to be finished late in term 1.

This means at the start of term 2, 2018 we will have our classes back in their new areas. This is such an exciting time for us and we are really looking forward to the flexible learning spaces this re-development will provide us.

Once this area has been completed, we will allow ourselves some time to settle and then we will re-develop the other side of the main building.

The second side development will not be as extensive as the first but will still offer flexible learning areas and separate classrooms.

A busy Term ahead!

Next term will be busy as usual with year 7 Graduation Night, budgets, class organization, reports, transition mornings for Pre-school and year 7 students and our current students visiting their 2018 class, Volunteers Morning Tea, class parties, excursions and so much more. So it will be important to read the newsletter to keep track of school events.

Deputy Principal position

Unfortunately our Deputy Principal position was not advertised in week 8 as DECD personnel had agreed. It will be advertised this week and we will begin the panel process during next term.

We anticipate the position will be filled and the successful candidate will begin working at our wonderful school next year. In the mean time we will be advertising the Acting Deputy's position internally this week. The successful candidate should be in-place for the beginning of term 4.

Students who are on school grounds before 8.30am and after 3.30pm are not supervised and the school is not able to take responsibility for them. Before 8.30am students need to wait under the shelter near the staffroom and after 3.30pm they are asked to come to the office so we can contact families.

Student Attendance

There has been a lot of illness in the school this term for both staff and students. If your child is not well, please do not send them to school to infect others. However, apart from illness and the occasional exemption (only provided by the Principal for specific occasions) we expect all students to attend school every day.

Student achievement is affected by absence and a pattern of absence affects a child for their whole life. Some children will miss up to a term of learning during the year just by missing a day a week or a couple of days a fortnight. So please be very mindful of your child's attendance.

Bullying?

We hear the word bully so often in the media. At our school we do come across some cases of bullying but in the main it is un-kind behaviour that we see. Un-kind behaviour is not necessarily bullying but is still an issue we deal with. It is important though, to make sure staff members are aware of such issues so we can deal with them. Much of what we are seeing at school is children who are showing signs of anxiety and therefore they do not deal with conflict, relationships and the challenges of school well. If you think your child is suffering from anxiety please speak to your GP and discuss further support options for him/her.

Choir performance

Unfortunately I was un-well and could not attend the Festival of Music when our fabulous choir performed. I was very disappointed about missing this wonderful event. I hear our students were fantastic, as usual, and enjoyed the experience.

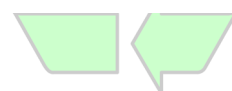

FEES

The fee for each day varies depending on the activity. Our base fee is \$50 per child. Please see our program to the left for total fees for each day (this includes all additional fees). All fees are subject to Child Care Rebate (CCR) and Child Care Benefit (CCB) depending on your eligibility. A Cancellation Fee will be incurred if parents/carers fail to notify the service by 5.30pm the night before care is needed.

MEALS and DIETARY NEEDS

Children are to bring their own lunch and drink bottle. BOSH will provide morning and afternoon tea. Please be aware that children with severe nut allergies attend the service during Holiday Care. Please ensure that no packed food contains nuts.

CHILD TO STAFF RATIOS

BOSH operates on a child:staff ratio of 15:1 (This does not include children with special needs and their carers). Our excursion ratio is 8:1.
